

Lansdell is recognized for his charitable donations

Cameron Lansdell, the owner of the 1-800-GOT-JUNK? franchise in Gainesville, donated \$50,000 worth of goods in 2011 to local charities and nonprofit organizations that included Heaven Hospice and Children's Home Society thrift stores.

In his business, Lansdell and his two-man crew every day pick up hundreds of gently used and unused items, which he then delivers to warehouse space provided by Haven Hospice Attic Store, where charity staff can select needed items. Haven Hospice Thrift Store provides warehouse space in exchange for Lansdell providing bulk disposal services to the Haven Hospice Attic Store.

Lansdell's donation for 2011 was equivalent to half of his business's revenue for the year.

In recognition of his charitable and sustainable initiatives, Lansdell was nominated for the 2011 Ethics in Business

award, which is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Gainesville in collaboration with the University of Florida Center for Leadership and Ethics in Business, and honors organizations and individuals who demonstrate ethical business practices at the highest levels.
